From personalized intakes that identify your specific requirements to providing communication support as you navigate disaster assistance forms, our aim is to make the recovery process as smooth as possible. We're here to ensure that you have access to communication essentials, such as hearing aid and cochlear implant batteries, offering you a lifeline to connectivity.

Connection and Access to Information

Staying informed and connected is vital during recovery. We have established a communication access station on Maui with Wi-Fi hotspot, iPads, and webcam for those impacted to connect with loved ones and resources. We have also been <u>re-creating news and information brief content</u>, posted on social media outlets, accessible with ASL, captions, and voiceover as requested by community members.
