- A. Congratulations to Senator Eōmailani Kukahiko on being named Everly Scholar.
- B. Thanks for patience on parking. Have not been successful in determining solutions. PBS and Community College office parking lots are also Zone 1(one).
- C. Contractors have confirmed they will be putting up lights behind portables and they know about need for hand railings, etc. Not sure when that will happen.
- D. 2 modulars of the 4 are already on island but being stored.
- E. Strategic plan group is meeting. A report to the College will be forthcoming in spring 2019.
- F. Be a Hero campaign will run until March 2019. Do not know impact in order to determine if investment is worth it, the analytics not available.
- G. Thank you for list to be sent to Athletics. Do not know criteria for selection.
- H. COE is participating in Mānoa Green Days.
- I. Aloha United Way -
 - Dean Murata was chair for Mānoa-UH System raised over \$221,447. Goal was \$275,000.
 - Today is final day. COE increased from last year in donations
 - Remind units that Aloha United Way and Hawaii
 Foodbank are the only two charities approved by
 the university and only ones faculty can use UH
 email for raising funds. COE listserv (COE-L) for
 approved UH activities only. May use the

- COE-ETEC listserv for other fundraising activities because people can opt in/out of that email.
- J. In March 2019 Dean Murata was asked to coordinate the Keiki Fun Run. Now over 2,000 youth participating. Will be held on lower campus.
- K. November 2, 2018 President Lassner presentation on reorganization.
 - Board of Regents approved his proposal (Provost and President) in concept, but it still needs to go through a formal reorganization.
 - Consultation still needs to occur with GSO, ASUH, MFS, and others.
 - Lassner was aiming for July 2019 for budget reasons, but concern that not enough time for consultation to occur.
 - Feedback is starting to come in from certain groups.
- L. Tuition rates will remain stable and perhaps decrease for graduate programs to be more competitive with other colleges target for the next four years.
- M. Mānoa assessment reports due today. Almost all COE reports already in to date.
