GENERAL PROGRAM INFORMATION:

The Master of Education in Teaching (MEdT) dual licensure program in Secondary & Special Education is a statewide, two-year, field-based program designed for those pursuing careers in teaching who have earned baccalaureate degrees in fields other than education. This program allows candidates to receive two teaching licenses: one in a secondary content area (e.g. Math, Science, English, Social Studies, or Hawaiian Language) and one in special education (Mild/ Moderate disabilities), while also obtaining a Master's degree.

Field placements are made each semester by the cohort coordinators. Regardless of where candidates reside while in the program, it's their responsibility to provide their own transportation to assigned field placements anywhere on their home island and face-to-face meetings.

CLASS TYPE. LICENSE, INFORMATION

STATEWIDE PROGRAM (online/hybrid): Full-time, cohorted & CERTIFICATION program. Primarily online courses with limited face-to-face meetings each semester. Neighbor island candidates travel to Oahu on select weekends; some financial support is provided to assist with travel. Upon completion of this program, qualified candidates will be recommended for initial teacher licensure in a secondary content area and special education (grades 6-12). Graduates can become teachers of youth with and without disabilities at the secondary school level.

STIPENDS SCHOLARSHIPS

STIPENDS (31 Credits):

May be available to candidates who agree to teach SPED in a Hawaii DOE school for a minimum of 3 years after program completion.

FEDERAL TEACHER LOAN FORGIVENESS:

SPED teachers at Title I schools can qualify for up to \$17,500.00 in loan forgiveness.
